Lives of the Saints – First Vestry Meeting

The year 1973 was when the ecclesiastical parish of Brighton (that is, **Holy Trinity** church, Hartland) was annexed to Richmond. In his 1973 annual report the Rev **Roy Evans** described the arrangement as "on a temporary basis for the time being at least". Half a century later the "temporary"

placement remains. Here below, a diarist records her first Richmond vestry meeting.

12 September 1973: "11:30 am - a black and white warbler on maple tree, very tame. 1:00 pm - two flickers on the back lawn with several robins. 7:30 pm - chipping sparrow on top of feeder in sunlight. Went to my first Vestry meeting tonight. Helped with tea and coffee. Our first meeting with Richmond Corner. Present were: Mr. [Roy] Evans, chair, Lawrence Carpenter, Mr & Mrs Parkinson, Mr Bell from Jackson Falls, Mr Adrian Bell, Mr & Mrs Jack Giberson, Walter Harris, Mrs McLellan and Muriel, and Mr Milbury."
